



WHAT IS Corva?

The California Off Road Vehicle Association (CORVA) is a varied group of outdoor recreationalists who are extremely active in promoting the positive aspects of vehicular access on public lands and protecting that right.

The group is composed of the owners of "Green Sticker" vehicles such as ATV's, motorcycles, 3-wheelers, trials bikes, and dune buggies, as well as "street-legal" 4X4 vehicles, dual sport motorcycles, bajas and desert racers.

The main purpose of CORVA is to work with the land managers for responsible off-highway vehicular access and recreation opportunities. Secondarily, we educate our membership on the constantly changing rules and regulations and promote conservation, clean-up and trail maintenance projects.

We are very active in the political arena and pay for a lobbyist in Sacramento. We work closely with the State Department of Parks and Recreation providing input to the Off-Highway Motor Vehicle Recreation (OHMVR) Program from the users' standpoint. We provide a valuable resource to land managers in the form of dedicated OHV enthusiasts who believe in responsible vehicular access.

A portion of the budgets for California's national forests and the public lands administered by the BLM is funded by grants from the Green Sticker Program. We work with the land managers to formulate the grants and give our input about the grants to the OHMVR Program which administers them. We also review how effectively our Green Sticker money was used in each program.

We are active at all levels of the land management public process with both the BLM and USFS. We do this by commenting on environmental documents on as many issues as possible and maintaining close relationships with personnel in the field as well as the staff.

We coordinate with other multiple use organizations ranging from snow-mobiles to horse enthusiasts to protect multiple-use rights from the environmental extremists. We are "dedicated to protecting our lands for the people, not from the people."

In Overdrive

The Next Step in Volunteering

Over the years as I look back on what I have written in the ORIA, you come to realize there are many forms of Volunteering by members and organizations on our public lands.

We have our "Friends" groups doing trash clean-up projects such as the Friends of El Mirage, Friends of Jawbone, Friends of Dumont Dunes, American Sand Association, Duners, Friends of Oceano Dunes, and Friends of Sand Mtn. with CORVA members supporting these efforts. They do a tremendous job of volunteering to keep our public lands clean and available for everyone's use – hikers included.

In order to keep up with the demand for trails and the reduction in available federal funds, we have entered a new level of volunteering and that is with the big ticket items like purchasing property and equipment to be used for trail management.

Why is this? Our tax money pays for lots of things, and one of them is appropriated dollars given by the federal government to the US Forest Service and BLM for the management of recreation. However, this money now has been cut so severely, that every year these agencies receive between 7 to 15 % LESS than the prior years. We can't find out who to blame for the cuts. Is it Congress or Washington DC agency management (USFS & BLM)? Thus, your tax dollar is not seeing its way to the area you recreate in.

Enter the California Green Sticker Program into this equation. For years, the California OHV Green Sticker Trust Fund has been providing good support in the form of OHV Grants for O & M (Operations and Maintenance) to supplement the funds the federal government provides in the USFS & BLM areas. However, that, too, has now dwindled to \$3.5 million dollars for the entire State of California. Why because

"Conservation, Restoration and Enforcement" is taking up the balance of \$14.5 million dollars per year of your OHV Grant money.

Now enter our next level of Volunteering to the equation. Friends of Jawbone has purchased 3 vacant lots in Randsburg so that visitors can park on this lot, not on the street, or private property.

For those that don't know, Randsburg is a destination to ride to when riding in the California City, El Paso Mtns., Jawbone, Dove Springs riding areas. In Randsburg, you can pull up to a tiny historic mining town and grab a bite to eat, an ice cream, a Sassparrilla or other cold beverage, and hang out with friends for some good 'ol bench racing. Since this is such a popular destination, the town is bursting with families on bikes, quads and buggies looking for a place to rest after a long ride. So, parking is a definite issue on large three-day weekends.

By purchasing the 3 vacant lots, the Friends of Jawbone have been able to accommodate both the riders needs and the town's need to control the traffic. The town appreciates the riders, because the visitors are a major source of income in this small desolate desert town, but traffic flow and safety is also a concern.

Kern County, CA Code Enforcement is

trying to accommodate our parking by working on a Conditional Use Permit. We are thankful to Kern County Board of Supervisors Jon McQuiston and Don Maben in supporting us in this effort.

Getting involved in our local government has proven effective in this case. We have worked hard to educate our local County Board of Supervisors. Off-roading is a major economic benefit to the county and they are smart to

recognize this and welcome us.

We have received Grants from the federal government's Recreational Trails Program (RTP) to purchase quads and rakes in El Mirage and Jawbone. Anyone who wants to run a quad with a rake behind it to maintain and groom the trails is welcome to contact us. We will have you trained by our quad trainer and you will be ready to help in grooming trails for all to enjoy.

Additionally, we are waiting to receive money to acquire a water truck from RTP Grants for Friends of El Mirage.

Friends of Jawbone and CORVA made another acquisition and that was purchasing a dump truck, trailer and BobCat tractor with blade and bucket. Now, why would we do this? We don't have the money. Agreed. However, we also have trails that are in desperate need of weekly and monthly maintenance and the state and federal government agencies are not doing their job of maintaining them due to budget cuts. We have trash out in the desert that needs to be picked up before we become a dump desert rather than a nice beautiful desert. If we don't do something NOW, the antigroups will shut us down.

My wife Linda and I personally paid for this equipment \$40,450 out of our line of

CORVA Founding Member Bob Ham Inducted into Off-Road Hall of Fame

The voting committee for the Off-Road Motorsports Hall of Fame (ORMHOF) gathered recently to consider nominations for inductees into the Off-Road Motorsports Hall of Fame. A group of 17 voting committee members consisting of previous inductees and representatives from the Four-Wheeling Community, Off-Road Racing Organizations, Rally Racing Sanctioning Groups, Motorcycle Manufacturing and Off-Road Aftermarket Industries ultimately voted to induct five new members to ORMHOF's Class of 2006.

Bob Ham

One of two inductees in the *Pioneer:* Advocate category is San Felipe, Mexico resident, Bob Ham. A lobbyist and offroader, Ham has served virtually every segment of the sport for years with uncommon effectiveness. Passing the time with Ham on the Malecon, in San Felipe, enjoying a glass of Chablis and a fine cigar, it's easy to forget how much this man has accomplished over the years.

Ham was the co-founder of the California Off-Road Vehicle Association (CORVA) in 1969 and in 1983 created the Off Road Vehicle Legislative Coalition that united all California off-road organizations into a single lobbying effort. Ham worked with Interior Secretary James Watt's staff to successfully re-establish the Barstow to Vegas motorcycle race and has finished the 'Baja 1000' on three separate occasions as a Driver of Record.

Ham has worked as a lobbyist for the Motorcycle Industry Council (MIC), The Specialty Vehicle Industry Council (SVIA) and the Motorcycle Safety Foundation among many others. He created the Off-Highway Motor Vehicle Recreation Commission through a bill that he wrote in 1982. He changed the OHV Special fund to a "Trust Fund" in 1993 which put a stop to the legislature misappropriating money from OHV funds to balance state budgets. Later he contacted an attorney to force the state to return funds previously taken from the OHV fund which resulted in the return of 30 million dollars to the OHV program. The next

time you fire up that race car, motorcycle, ATV, RV or 4WD, remember that Bob Ham is one of those special people whose lifelong efforts have made it possible for you to enjoy our wilderness areas.

Clark Collins

Our second inductee to the *Pioneer:* Advocate category, is Pocatello, Idaho's Clark Collins. An avid trail rider, Collins joined the Idaho Trail Machine Association (ITMA) in the early eighties. In 1986 Clark was honored as the ITMA's 'Trailbike Rider of the Year' and served as that groups president several times.

It was in this capacity, that Clark met with Idaho Governor, John Evans, to enlist his assistance in opposing the increasing closure of public lands to off-highway users. Evans told Clark that he and his friends were "politically insignificant". Although the comment took Clark by surprise, it made him realize that the off-road community had to do something to become more politically active.

In 1987 Clark co-founded the Blue Ribbon Coalition and served as the BRC's Executive Director from 1988 until his retirement in January of 2006. During that time the BRC has grown to include over 1100 member organizations and businesses nationwide representing approximately 600,000 off-roaders. The group successfully opposed Governor Evan's campaign for Senator in 1988 and has been instrumental in supporting important legislation to keep off-highway areas accessible to OHV use.

Sal Fish

In the *Competition: Off-Road Racing* category, the next inductee is Sal Fish, President and CEO of SCORE International.

After a stint in the family automotive business, Fish took a job selling advertising at Petersen Publishing Company in 1966. In the space of a few years, he worked his way into an executive role at Petersen. In 1974, shortly after the late Mickey Thompson founded SCORE International, Thompson brought Fish on board to take

over the operations of the new sanctioning body.

Fish brought innovation to SCORE: organizing class rules; implementing safety procedures; and transforming the 'Baja 1000' into one of the most recognized motorsports events in the world today.

In 1985 Fish brought unity to the sport when SCORE formed a combined series with Walt Lott and High Desert Racing Association (HDRA). Fish later teamed up with CFO, Ted Johnson to purchase SCORE International from Thompson in 1986 and HDRA in 1993. There is little doubt that Sal Fish is the architect of off-road racing as we know it today.

Macey L. "Corky" McMillin

The second inductee in the *Competition:*Off-Road Racing category is Macey L.
"Corky" McMillin, known simply as "Corky".

Corky moved from Missouri to Chula Vista, CA when he was 14. In 1960, he started a small construction company in Bonita, CA with his wife, Vonnie, looking after the accounting duties.

While McMillin was busy building houses, he loved taking his family to the Imperial Sand Dunes on the weekends. As sons Mark and Scott got older, they decided that they would try their hand at off-road racing. Corky's first venture into a competitive event came at the 1976 'Baja 1000' with his son, Mark. Although the father-son team did not finish that first race, Corky kept after it and his first win came in the 1979 'Baja 1000'. McMillin went on to win many more races including the 'Baja 500', 'Baja 1000', 'Parker 400', 'San Felipe 250 and 'Fireworks 250', most of them multiple times. Over the years McMillin won three SCORE Points Championships and on two occasions won overall titles at both the 'San Felipe 250' and the 'Baja 500'.

As the McMillin Companies continued to prosper, Corky expanded into different markets, eventually becoming one of the largest private developers in the country. Always a firm believer in the importance of supporting off-road racing, The McMillin Companies have been event sponsors at Best in the Desert and SCORE races, earning SCORE's Entry Sponsor of the Year award in 2005. Since 2001 The McMillin Companies have also been title sponsor of

Update on Frank Raines Park — Kelly Corona, our Northern CORVA Club Rep. is establishing a Friends of Frank Raines. We have held some meetings. We have a lot of issues regarding Frank Raines Park, located near Patterson, CA.

This park is where we hold the CORVA Northern Jamboree. Our biggest issue is closure. Due to a fire in recent years, the vegetation which created a natural barrier and trail definition was lost. Now, some riders are going into the private lands of our neighbors.

During the first week of May, Cathy Gomes, from the Stanislaus County Parks Service, requested that someone from one of our clubs take her and two people from the State on a ride around Frank Raines Park. The Fire Department could close the Park OHV area if they couldn't get trucks in

there to fight a fire and the main fire road was in bad shape.

So, Jim Logan, President of East Bay Hi Tailers, and Roy Studebaker took their buggies and met with Cathy and Joe from the County, and Tim and Bruce from the State. Jim took Cathy in his buggy; Roy took Joe, and Tim and Bruce had their own quad/bikes.

Bruce said he would like to see the creek where it leaves the park. He told us how they could make a filter system to clean the water at this point. Then he showed them how they could make a smiley face (a mound of dirt or water bar) at the bottom of the hills to keep the silt from going into the creek. The club showed them the fire road to both ends of the park and then went back to the camp area and went over what they discovered and made some plans. They

made an agreement that the county along with the help of the clubs would be doing all the work to keep the park open and to comply with regulations. Tim said he would have a bulldozer and an operator there ASAP to work on the fire road.

So, they showed up and started work on the road, up to the white gate at the new

Moose Anderson Days Clean Up and Trail Restoration Project

The Friends of Jawbone welcomed 174 volunteers to Moose Anderson Weekend at Jawbone Station in April. Both mornings started with a hearty pancake breakfast prepared by members of CORVA.

T-shirts and a tri-tip lunch were provided free to each preregistered volunteer. Kern County Search and Rescue again cooked a delicious lunch.

There were four clean-up and/or restoration projects taking place on Saturday which included cleanups along Jawbone Road, in Dove Springs and, along with Kern County Supervisor Don Maben, many volunteers pulled up tamarisk shoots in the closed area behind Jawbone canyon. Ten members of the BMPC club (a CORVA club) did signing along Route SC 175 and repaired the kiosk at the Josie Bishop claim. BLM area manager Hector Villalobos visited each site during the day and Steve Colerick of California City Police Department also was present.

Land AcQuisition

Truckhaven to be Acquired for OHV Recreation

The California State Parks Off Highway Motor Vehicle Recreation (OHMVR) Commission recently voted to approve the acquisition of the popular recreation area known as Truckhaven.

OHMVR Trust Funds, along with funding from the federal highway funds will be used to purchase 4,300 acres of lands used by off-road recreation for over 50 years.

The acquisition is expected to be final in August-September, 2006.

For the near term, few immediate changes are expected. The area will come under management control of the adjacent Ocotillo Wells State Vehicle Recreation

area. Over the course of the next 2-3 years, a comprehensive management plan will be developed for the area. There is an expectation that some area will be set aside as "buffer" for the housing and there are a number of archeology sites that will be protected.

During the State Parks presentation to the OHMVR Commission in support of the acquisition project, officials noted that in spite of the signs of heavy recreation use, the area was in better condition that other developed recreation areas. One of the OHMVR Commission members toured the area earlier in the week and commented that the area was surprisingly free of trash that is normal in other heavy use recreation areas. The Native American Tribes in the region are in full support of the keeping Truckhaven open for recreation.

Truckhaven is the site of Tierra del Sol Desert Safari drawing thousands of visitors to the area the first weekend of every March.

Desert Safari is one of three major OHV events held in the area. An estimated 90,000 recreationists per year visit the area.

Over the past few months, there has been a lot of behind the scenes political maneuvering. On two occasions, members of the Tierra del Sol Four Wheel Drive Club of San Diego provided area tours for State Park officials and Tribal Leaders. One Tribal representative remarked about her familiarity with Tierra del Sol as her father was a friend of Tierra del Sol founding member Bozzy Willis.

Numerous individual and organization letters were written to southern California Assemblymen and Senators urging their support for the acquisition 26 of them signed a letter to the Commission urging a "yes" vote on the acquisition.

In the end, an expected close vote was a surprising 7-0 vote in favor of acquisition.

[Rick Fisher of CORVA pointed out that this purchase is only about 30% of the area now in use. Rick personally took Daphne Greene, OHMVR Deputy Director on a tour of the area shortly after our CORVA Truckhaven Challenge event. CORVA has been intimately involved in this issue, working to make it a beneficial transfer for OHV interests. - Erin Dyer, Editor]

Cathedral City Bans OHV's in City Limits

Cathedral City, California City Council ioins the growing list of local governments who have voted to ban off-highway vehicle (OHV) recreation. The City Council voted 4-1 to make all riding of OHVs in the city limits illegal, including riding on private property. The ordinance, which took effect during the last week of April, will also give police the power to confiscate violators' vehicles.

Fines for violating the ordinance will begin at \$250 and increase to \$500 for a second offense, \$750 for a third and \$1,000 for all subsequent offenses within a 12month period. Offenders will likely be subpoenaed and charged based on witness reports rather than caught in the act according to Police Chief Stanley Henry.

Unfortunately this is an all too common problem all across this country with the

advent of urban sprawl and the perpetuation of the "NIMBY" mindset. The AMA Government Relations Department does all it can to protect your right to ride. As a member-driven organization, one of our most effective tools is our ability to muster grassroots political action.

the Superstition Series, a local series of off-road races held in Plaster City, East of San Diego.

Corky McMillin once said, "The best thing we have isn't our money in the bank, it's our reputation." He was the elder statesman of off-road racing. Corky passed away from heart failure on September 22, 2005 at the age of 76. His passing leaves a void in the heart of off-road motorsports which cannot be filled. We are honored to induct him into the Off-Road Motorsports Hall of Fame!

Ivan "Ironman" Stewart

The third inductee in the *Competition:* Off-Road Racing category is Ivan "Ironman" Stewart, a legend in off-road racing. Stewart has won 82 major desert and short-course races and ten Points Championships. He has won the 'Baja 500' a record 17 times,

the 'Mint 400 eight times, the 'Parker 400' four times, three 'Baja 1000's and four SCORE World Championships.

Stewart's career began in 1973 at the Ensenada 300. He was scheduled to codrive in a Class 2 buggy with Bill Hrynko, but Hrynko suffered a broken leg prior to the event. Mechanic Earl Stah took the second seat and Stewart drove the entire race to victory. In the next ten years, the Ironman went on to win 26 races in buggies and trucks and was voted SCORE's Driver of the Year four different times.

In 1983 Stewart was tapped by Cal Wells at Precision Preparation Inc. (PPI) to drive Toyota factory sponsored trucks in the Desert and Stadium events. Stewart and several other teammates played an important role in Toyota's dominance during the 12 year history of the Mickey Thompson Entertainment Group (MTEG) stadium series. Along with Stewart's three

In addition to his on-track career, Stewart is the founder of the Protruck Racing Organization (PRO). A "spec" racing series with identical chassis, the Protrucks race as a special class at various events, including the Best in the Desert Racing Association, the SCORE series and Pike's Peak. To date, Protruck has built 45 trucks in its ten year history.

area with a high volume of riders. We need to keep the riding experience enjoyable and keep the riders on the trail, instead of having them avoid the dreaded miles of whoops.

We have rented a skip-loader from Hertz Rental in Lancaster who have helped us by giving us a price that makes it possible for us to rent bigger equipment. They are incredible people that understand that we are working on public land for the public's enjoyment.

We will start picking up trash, using the Bobcat to haul the debris to the dump truck, which we will then transport to the dump. Benz, the California City trash collection company, has agreed to receive this trash that originates from California City limits and Kern County Supervisor Don Maben is providing a Dump Card for use at the County Trash Dump in Mojave for anything picked up on County and public property. Wayne and Ann Nossala from California City have been helping us by getting the lights working on the 2000 GMC Dump Truck, which was bought used.
