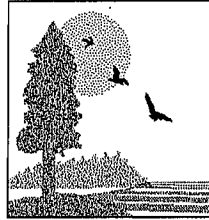

Subject: 12th Annual Truckhaven Challenge, Poker Run and Satellite Safari

It has come to the attention of staff of the California State Lands Commission (CSLC) that your organization, CORVA (California Off-Road Vehicle Association), is planning an off-road vehicle event known as the 12th Annual Truckhaven Challenge for the weekend of January 20-21, 2007 in an area west of Salton City. The event includes a "Poker Run" over a pre-determined course on Saturday, January 20 and a "Satellite Safari" on Sunday, January 21, wherein participants will be "on their own" to navigate their own course to a location identified only by GPS coordinates.

For your information, the CSLC has authority over a number of parcels of land in the area, which are depicted on the enclosed map, where the events are scheduled to be held. These lands are known as "school lands" because they are held in a trust created by the State Legislature in 1984 for the benefit of the State Teachers' Retirement System (STRS). The CSLC is the trustee for this trust and manages these lands on behalf of STRS.


Acting in its capacity as trustee of these lands, the CSLC requires that anyone who desires to use these lands for any purpose, including events such as the Truckhaven Challenge, must first obtain authorization from the CSLC. The issuance of any lease, permit or other entitlement for use of State lands requires review for compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). The terms of CEQA may be found in the California Public Resources Code (PRC), Sections 21000 et seq., and in the State CEQA Guidelines, California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Sections 15000 et seq. No proposed project or use will be approved until the requirements of CEQA have been met. Additionally, if the application involves lands found to contain "Significant Environmental Values" within the meaning of PRC Section 6370, consistency of the proposed use with the identified values must also be determined through the CEQA

review process. Pursuant to its regulations the Commission may not issue a lease for use of "Significant Lands" if such use is detrimental to the identified values.

This letter serves as notice to you and CORVA that CORVA has no authorization to use state-owned school lands for the Truckhaven Challenge. Please advise your members and any other event participants that permission to cross State lands under the jurisdiction of the CSLC has not been granted, and make every effort to assure that such trespassing will not occur.

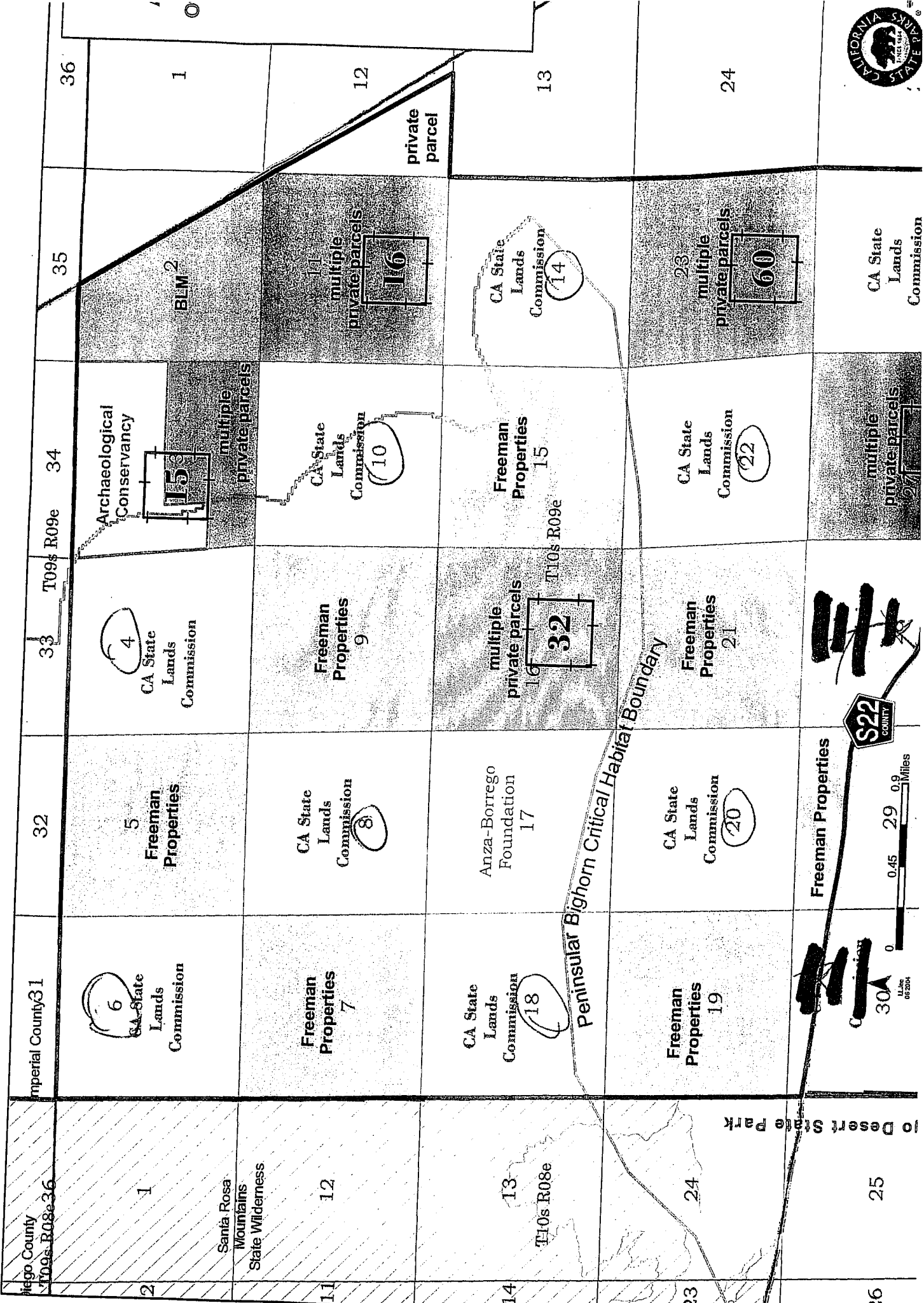
